WHO SHOULD ATTEND PARISH RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (CCD) CLASSES?

All children who attend: Public School

Non-Catholic Christian School Non-Catholic Private School

Home School

Parish Religious Education (CCD) classes are not just for Sacrament preparation. Children should attend classes every year from Kindergarten through the time that they receive Confirmation (typically 8th grade).

WHEN SHOULD I REGISTER MY CHILD FOR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (CCD) CLASSES? The Registration Period will begin on May 20, 2018 and end on June 24, 2018.

HOW MUCH DOES IT COST?

There is a yearly fee that covers the cost of books and supplies.

1. The Fee for 2018/2019 is: \$45.00 for one child

\$80.00 for two children

\$110.00 for three or more children

2. If you were registered in the program during the 2017/2018 school year and are registering **after**

June 24, a \$15.00 late fee will apply as follows: \$60.00 for one child

\$95.00 for two children

\$125.00 for three or more children

- 3. Payment in installments can be arranged, if necessary
- 4. Please make checks payable to ST. EDWARD'S CHURCH
- 5. There is no fee for the children of Catechists

REGISTRATION REQUIREMENTS:

- 1. Children registering for Level 2 (Children receive Reconciliation and Communion during this year) must have completed Level 1Religious Education in a Catholic Parish Religious Education program or a Catholic school
- 2. Children registering for Confirmation Level 3 (typically 8th grade) must have completed Religious Education for Confirmation Levels 1 and 2 (typically 6th and 7th Grade)
- 3. The Pre-School Program is for 3, 4 and 5 (those who will turn 5 after September 1, 2018) year old children who are potty trained
- 4. Children registering for Kindergarten must be 5 by September 1, 2018 or registered in a school Kindergarten program

HOW DO I REGISTER MY CHILD FOR RELIGIOUS EDUCATION (CCD) CLASSES?

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES

- 1. Classes are taught by volunteer Catechists. Catechists do not have to be professional teachers; the most important qualification is a desire to share your Catholic faith with the children of our parish. The text books come with teacher manuals. If you are interested in teaching, please contact Maureen Curtis for detailed information.
- 2. There is always a need for substitute teachers to be available when a Catechist can't be at class. Sometimes the need is known a few weeks in advance but at others it is a last-minute notice. Please contact Maureen Curtis if you would like to be on the Substitute list.
- 3. There is a volunteer opportunity for those who can't make a weekly commitment but still want to be a part of the faith journey of the children of our parish. During the year we have several retreats for the students and their families who are preparing to receive Reconciliation, Eucharist and Confirmation. If there is anyone who would like to help plan and lead these retreat, please contact Maureen Curtis for detailed information.
- 4. At the end of each session the students wait outside for their ride. It would be wonderful to have parents volunteer to be "Parking Lot Monitors" who would wait with the children to make sure that they are safe. We always try to ensure that there are at least 2 adults waiting and many times the 2nd adult is a volunteer teacher; it would be great to let the teacher clean up their classroom, talk to parents and students or get home to their families without worrying about the pick-up activities.

All volunteers must have a background check completed through the Archdiocese before they can work with children.
